Ontario is helping the Champlain Local Integration Health Network (LHIN) and LHINs across the province provide more seniors with at-home care, reduce unnecessary emergency room visits and readmissions, decrease the number of patients waiting for alternate levels of care, and increase local mental health and addiction services.

This investment is helping deliver on Ontario's Action Plan for Health Care by providing the right care at the right time, and in the right place. The Champlain LHIN is receiving an increase of more than \$11 million to fund local programs this year. This additional funding will be used in the following ways:
